Dear members of Skivehus Rotary Club and Schwerin Rotary Club and all Rotary Clubs of Arizona, Chairman and all members of Himalayan Project Denmark, members of PONA Foundation, and all our supporters, GREETINGS!

We are very pleased and grateful towards your valuable support for our school. Here we present you our progress report the following.

Chhimbu Primary School was established in 1999 by Skivehus Rotary Club Denmark, Rotary Club Schwerin, Germany and Himalayan Project Denmark. Mr. Kurt Lomborg, who is known as Papa through his philanthropic work, has played the vital role during the establishment phase and in running phase. Late Ang Gelbu Sherpa and Rinji Sherpa donated the land and local community donated sufficient labor donation during the construction of the school building.

Chhimbu is remote area and dominant place of backward community of Thami people. They are indigenous cast and backward in all aspect in the society. When Kurt Lomborg and his group trekking in the area, he found Chhimbu special for him, he felt impressive with the people as well as geography and felt bad when he knew that children of this village had no education in the lack of school. So he decided to do something for the people. He raised fund for building a small school to educate the children of Thami people. As a result he built this school in 1999 and started giving education recruiting two teachers Jangbu and Bhimsen.

In the very beginning all the expenditure had been born through the support provided by Himalayan Project Denmark and Skivehus Rotary club. Class 1 and class 2 were operated with 38 kidsin the first year, and then the school was gradually upgraded for Primary level (up to grade 5)with the salary support from government for one teacher (Bhimsen), later he was promoted for headmaster. A few years later, Government of Nepal added one more teacher salary (Yashoda), and PONA-Foundation took over the school running cost. Two more teachers, Pasi and Damu Phuti, were employed by Village Development Committee (VDC) for short terms and now PONA Foundation pays most part of their salary as VDC support is decreasing as the

agreement. VDC also supported to build extra room in 2003. In 2008 HP renovated the whole school building and government supported for water supply and new toilet construction replacing the old one. Finally, Chhimbu School has been model school of in the area with sufficient number of teachers and students. Now there are 5 teachers as well as one peon and around 40kids every year. With all the facilities and dedication of the teachers, the education standard has set a record in the area, and school has been known as the best school. All the children who have been educated in this school do always well in other school in their higher level. This has proved the importance of the Chhimbu School.

However, we are quite concerned about the sustainability to run the school in full scale. HP informed us that PONA-Foundation might not support in the future. If it is the situation, the school will go down with only two government teachers.

According to our school record, we have completed more than a decade. During this period, 26 Girls and 30 Boys passed class 5 and took further education in other school. Few of them dropped out of the school. Some of them are having Secondary level education and very few of them are studying high school and university which is great achievement for the school. In this way education is spreading among the Poor and uneducated Thami people who were totally unaware about Education.

Teacher-Parents Meeting

For the last 3 years we have regular teacher parents' interaction. Now we have committee of Teachers Parents Committee which is working for the betterment of the school. It was also demand of the Himalayan Project Denmark and District Education Office of Solukhumbu. During the interaction program, we discuss about children's behavior, their personal hygiene, regularity in doing homework and attendance as well as teachers' performance and extracurricular, and which has been very effective in improving the educational standard of the school.

We also have regular meeting of the teacher staff every month and special meeting when needed. In this meeting we discuss about children's education, their day to day improvement in each subject, hygiene, and their regularity in doing homework and interaction. We also seek the reason behind and find out the solution for those who have the problem.

We also did students enrolment campaign in the beginning of the new school year to increase the number of students in the school.

Some years ago there was a rumor of the villagers that Kinja School was best school among all schools of Bakanje. But last year Danish Teacher Leif & Bodil visited all schools of Bakanje, observed the school standard and provided training. We learned lot of ideas and technique of teaching and preparing materials for related subject and unit. Later they observed particular teacher's class. When they back to Denmark they gave their report that Chhimbu School is best among all, we received the same comment from WEP-SEP program run under Women Empowerment Project. We believed all those positive comments encourage us for establishing improving even more in the future.

From Last year, we started play group for small children (2 - 3 years) to make them habit of coming to school. We provide good environment and felling to that kid to make them come to school every day. It has been quite efficient program with first comer kids to start the school.

Once a year we organize cultural and sports event for kids, their parents and teachers on the occasion of parents' day. We also have the provision of presents for best performer. It has helped in creating good environment for kids, parents and teachers.

Bakanje Youth Club organized primary level Inter School Quiz contest and our school became first among 7 schools participated. From this program also we can judge our students are developing and trying to do something.

Chhimbu School organized Educational Tour every year when we take elder students to different place to give new experience about nature, culture, geography etc. Last event was taken place in last October when 15 kids, 3 teachers and 4parents trekked to Pikey Hill which is 4, 500 Meter height. It was nice day with completely blue sky, we had a nice view of all Mountain Ranges including Mt. Everest and there has lot of fun. Everybody was so happy and pleased.

HP scholarships program also has helped for poor disable and orphan children. Many students were benefited from this program and some of them are studying Higher Education and University level.

Conclusion

School is running very efficient way with regular class and full of extra events.

Teachers are very enthusiastic and regular, and ready to improve for better. This will bring lot of positive changes towards to improvement of education standard.

Now there are 6 staff (5 teachers and one peon), government pays for two teachers and for peon, they are Bimsen, Yasoda and Sarkini. PONA-Foundation pays 3 teachers, full salary for Jangbu and half salary for Pasi and Damu Phuti, their half salary are paid by VDC who have discontinued their support from this year.

We are aware Chhimbu School will go down with only government teachers without PONA-Foundation support. In this case, Chhimbu school quality will also go down. And three teachers paid by PONA-Foundation will be unemployed.
